A product of Wisconsin public schools, Tony Evers has spent 34 years working on the front lines of public education in Wisconsin. He is a proud parent of public school graduates and grandparent of a Wisconsin kindergartener. As State Superintendent, Evers will be bring unity around the mission to fulfill every child's birthright to a quality education as well as the goal to ensure that every child will become a graduate with the 21st century skills they need to succeed.
